We appreciate your dedication and prompt attention to this matter during these challenging times.

Please help us conserve water by adhering to the standards below.

-  No automatic irrigation should be used between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.
-  Irrigation is limited to no more than 10 minutes per station per day.
-  Watering outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes runoff onto adjoining sidewalk, driveway, alley, or gutter is prohibited.
-  Irrigating lawn, shrubs, or ornamental landscape during and 48 hours after a measurable rainfall is prohibited.
-  Washing a vehicle (including cars, trucks, boats, trailers, and recreational vehicles) requires the use of a hand-held bucket or hose equipped with an auto shut-off nozzle.
-  Water fountains or decorative features are required to use recirculation systems.
-  Washing down hard or paved surfaces, including, but not limited to, sidewalks, walkways, driveways, parking areas, tennis courts, patios or alleys, is prohibited.
-  Watering non-functional grass on commercial properties is prohibited.
